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

The "E" in ESG

- "ESG" is a taxonomy that describes and categorizes certain nonfinancial factors that impact a corporation's bottom line.
- "Sustainability" refers to business resiliency a result of the effective management of the nonfinancial factors included under the umbrella of ESG.
- Examples of factors included within ESG:

Environmental Social Governance Human capital management **Business** ethics Carbon emissions Diversity and Inclusion Anti-corruption Resource consumption and Health and Safety Anti-money laundering recycling Supply chain labor standards Privacy and data security Toxic emissions and waste Biodiversity and land use


